What to do in Bermuda?

Golf - When a country offers more golf courses than fast food outlets, there's something to be said.



Bermuda's nine golf courses offer a challenging layout for players of all skill levels. Each course has its distinct characteristics.

The unpredictable wind blowing in from the Atlantic is a factor which many golfers ignore at their peril. Elevated greens, typically guarded by sand traps, provide spectacular views of the ocean. Limited irrigation means that the greens and fairways tend to be firmer and slower than those found in the US. To top it all, aquatic hazards are the highlight of many Bermuda golf courses.

Bermuda - The Island



Bermuda's unusual pink sand beaches and clear, cerulean blue ocean waters are popular with tourists and many of

Bermuda's hotels are located along the south shore of the island. In addition to its beaches, there are a number of sightseeing attractions.

Historic St. George's is a designated World Heritage Site. The most popular visitor attraction is the Royal Naval Dockyard, which includes the Bermuda Maritime Museum. Other attractions include the Bermuda Aquarium, Museum and Zoo, Bermuda Underwater Exploration Institute, the Botanical Gardens, lighthouses, and the Crystal Caves with its impressive stalactites and underground saltwater pools.



Scuba divers can explore numerous wrecks and coral reefs in relatively shallow water (typically 30-40 ft/9-12 m in depth) with virtually unlimited visibility. Many

nearby reefs are readily accessible from shore by snorkelers, especially at Church Bay.
